National Update: CMVA National Director Gurwinder Bhambra for Ken Keith

The Alignment Certification Committee, chaired by Dora Orchard (Atlantic Chapter), is fine tuning the CMVA Alignment Specialist Certification exam and is looking for trainers across the country to put on the course. Due to the logistics of shipping alignment training kits, CMVA will require trainers in each chapter to give the courses and administer the exams. Any training company interested in participating in training should contact Ken Keith.

The Balancing Certification Committee, Chaired by John French (BC Chapter) are in the beginning stages of creating a balancing specialist certification. This committee has members from BC, Prairie, Quebec and Atlantic who recently held their first meeting.

The Ultrasound Certification Committee, chaired by Allen Rienstra, are into the early stages of developing an Ultrasound Specialist certification. They are currently working on developing performance objectives and gathering and reviewing questions for two levels of certification.

The Cat IV Certification Committee, chaired by Dora Orchard (Atlantic) with administrative support from Hossein Farahani (Ontario), is close to having a Category IV vibration specialist exam ready to test. If you know someone who has had category IV training through VI, Mobius, or Technical Associates and may be willing to try the exam, please contact Ken Keith. The first few through the exam will not have to pay for exams or remote proctoring and may have the honor of being the first CMVA Cat IVs.

ATC and AGM - 2024 - Quebec Chapter – The 2024 Conference, exhibit, and training event will be held in Quebec City on the week of October 21-24. This year, due to availability at University Laval, the conferences and exhibition will be on Tuesday and Wednesday with Thursday and Friday scheduled for courses (to be announced).

ATC in Prairie Chapter for 2026 – Gurwinder will discuss with Prairie chapter at the March meeting. Historically CMVA has alternated between BC and Prairie for ATCs out west, but the decision has been made to do it every 5 years.
